

Guidelines for Stukesbary Health Professional College Scholarship

1. To be used for making educational grants to church family members and non-member spouses.
2. \$5,000 original gift must remain invested with only the interest being used for the scholarship; therefore, scholarship could vary from year to year, based on interest rates.
3. Stukesbary family specified areas of education are to be: ministry or health related programs such as medicine, nursing, pharmacy or medical technician.
4. Grant must be paid to the school of the applicant's choice for fees, tuition, etc.
5. Technical or trade school programs should be considered as well as post or pre-graduate collegiate education.
6. At the end of each year the Stukesbarys would like an accounting of the interest given to the recipient of the scholarship and name of the person and their area of study. (We receive this accounting from our regional office about March of each year for the previous year).
7. Locally we have added the following stipulations:
 - a. The scholarship will be offered in the local congregation first.
 - b. The scholarship will be offered in the cluster group if not applied for locally.
 - c. The scholarship will be offered in the mission center if not applied for in the cluster group.
 - d. The scholarship will be a maximum of \$500 when offered outside the congregation.
8. The scholarship will be advertised beginning in March by pastors, church newsletters, announcements and bulletins. Applications must be completed and submitted by April 30th of each year to the scholarship committee chairperson.
9. A committee of 3 people, appointed by the presiding elder will serve as the Scholarship Committee, and will advertise the scholarship and review the applicants, choosing one. The terms will revolve with one member serving for 3 years, one member serving for 2 years, and one member serving for 1 year. The presiding elder will be an ex-officio member of the committee.
10. Final decision will rest with the congregation at a business meeting.
